

# Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) Legislation in the UK

(Reporting to the police, known cases of FGM identified in under 18's)

## England and Wales

**Female Genital Mutilation Act 2003** - Illegal for UK Nationals or Permanent UK Residents to perform FGM on a girl overseas or aid/abet a UK national to undergo FGM in the UK or abroad.

**Serious Crime Act 2015** - Extended FGM Act 2003 protection to include UK habitual residents, Mandatory Reporting (for teachers, social workers and health professionals); Introduction of FGM Protection Orders and lifelong anonymity for survivor.

**Maximum penalty:** 14 years in prison.

**Failure to protect a girl: (parental responsibility)** 7 years in prison.

**Breach of FGM Protection order:** 5 years in prison.

## Scotland

**Female Genital Mutilation (Scotland) Act 2005** - Re-enacted the provisions of the 1985 Act. Illegal for UK Nationals or Permanent UK Residents to perform FGM on a girl overseas or aid/abet a UK national to undergo FGM in the UK or abroad.

**Serious Crime Act 2015** - Extended protection to habitual residence of UK (not just nationals).

**Maximum penalty:** 14 years in prison.



## Northern Ireland

**Female Genital Mutilation Act 2003** - Illegal for UK Nationals or Permanent UK Residents to perform FGM on a girl overseas or aid/abet a UK national to undergo FGM in the UK or abroad.

**Serious Crime Act 2015** - Extended FGM Act 2003 protection to habitual residence of UK (not just nationals); Introduction of FGM Protection Orders.

**Maximum penalty:** 14 years in prison.

**Failure to protect a girl (parental responsibility):** 7 years in prison.

**Breach of FGM Protection order:** 5 years in prison.
